Take exit 157B for Acadian Thwy toward LSU

Turn Left onto Acadian Thruway

Cross Perkins Road

Continue on Stanford Drive/LSU Avenue

Turn right onto Highland Road

Turn right onto Agcenter Drive, turn after Ag Chemistry Building

From I-10 East (from Lafayette, Port Allen)

Take exit 157B for Acadian Thwy toward LSU

Turn Right onto Acadian Thruway

Cross Perkins Road

Continue on Stanford Drive/LSU Avenue

Turn right onto Highland Road

Turn right onto Agcenter Drive, turn after Ag Chemistry Building
